

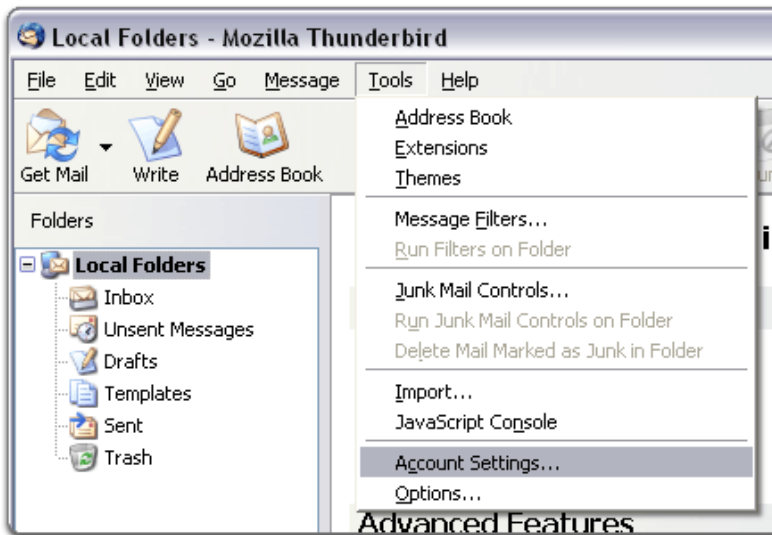


Setting Up Your E-mail in Mozilla Thunderbird

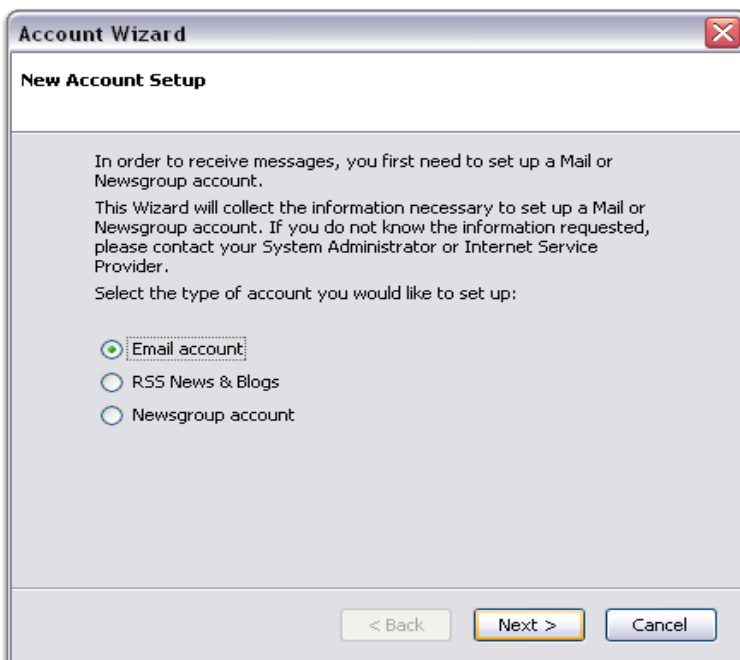
This tutorial will help you set up the Mozilla Thunderbird e-mail client to work with your e-mail account.

To Set Up Your E-mail Account in Mozilla Thunderbird

1. In Mozilla Thunderbird, select Tools > Account Settings.



2. Select "Email account " and click Next.





3. Enter your name and e-mail address.

4. Select "POP" as the type of incoming server you are using. Your incoming server is pop.secureserver.net. Click Next.

5. Enter your e-mail address for the "Incoming User Name," and "Outgoing User Name." Click Next.

User Names

Enter the incoming user name given to you by your email provider (for example, "jsmith").

Incoming User Name:

Enter the outgoing user name given to you by your email provider (this is typically the same as your incoming user name).

Outgoing User Name:

6. Enter a name for your e-mail account and click Next.

Account Name

Enter the name by which you would like to refer to this account (for example, "Work Account", "Home Account" or "News Account").

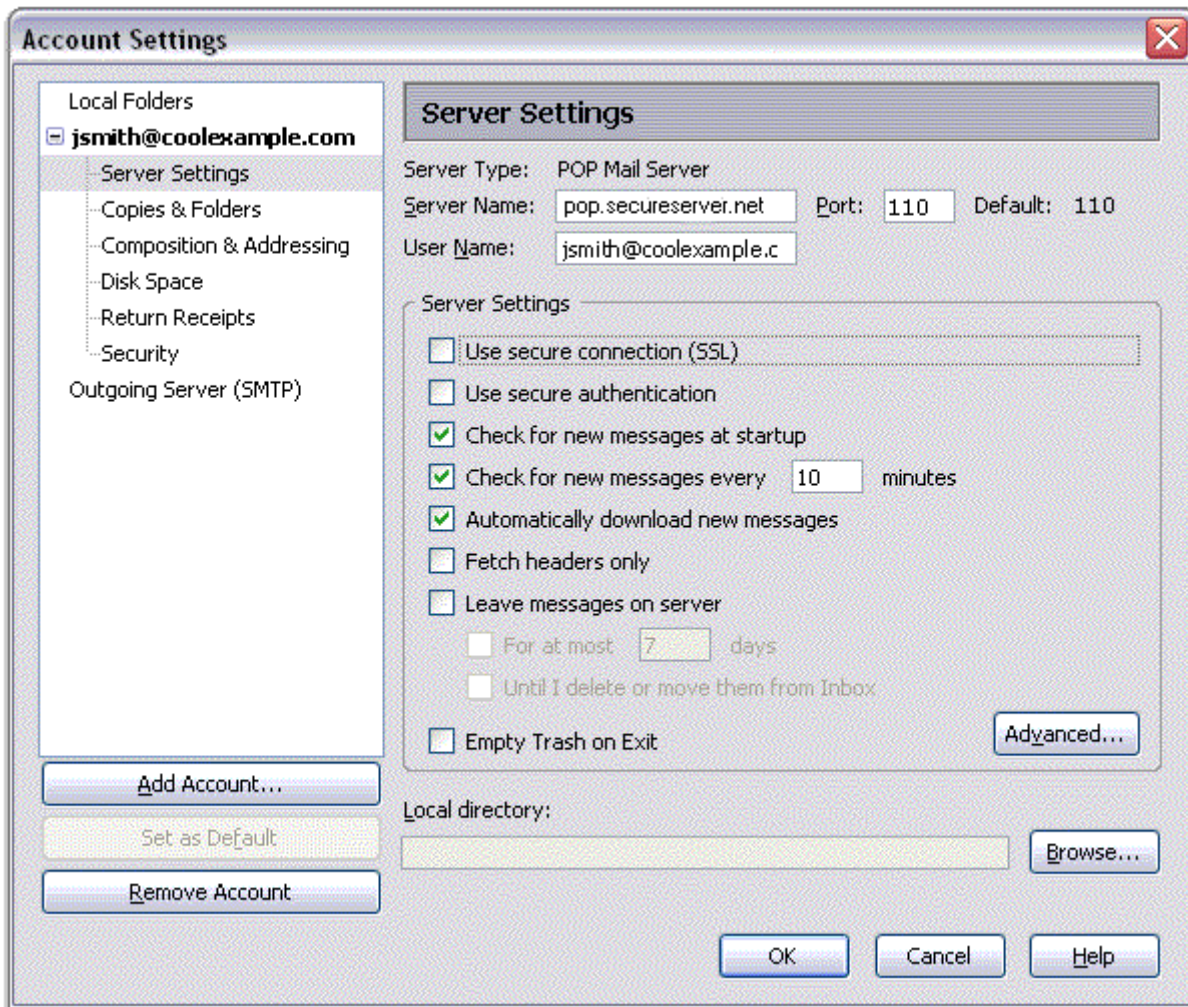
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7. Verify your account information and click Finish.
8. In the Account Settings window, select "Outgoing Server" listed below your new account.



9. Enter "mail.yourdomainname.com" for the "Server Name" and change the "Port" setting to 28.
(replace *mail.yourdomain.com* with Your domain e.g. if your domain is *bobsite.com* then it should be *mail.bobsite.com*)



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10. Select "Use name and password" and enter your e-mail address. Thunderbird will ask you for your password the first time you try to send mail. Click OK.
